Connecticut Treasures: Works from Private Collections

Many treasures exist in private collections, where they have been preserved by their owners, often over several generations. This exhibition builds on the generous spirit of those who collect the art of Connecticut. It features outstanding works of art that their owners have decided to share with the public, most for the first time.

With Needle and Brush: Schoolgirl Embroidery from the Connecticut River Valley

The Connecticut River Valley was one of the most important centers in America for the teaching and production of embroidered pictures by young girls in private academies during the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. Guest-curated by needlework experts Carol and Steve Huber, this exhibition of approximately fifty embroideries, watercolor sketches, and portraits draws extensively on works from private collections, many never before shown publicly.

Magic of Christmas

This year's Magic of Christmas features new artists' palettes on *Miss Florence's Artist Tree* and the homespun creativity of a 1910 Christmas in the Griswold House, but also a collection of fantasy trees decorated in themes that correspond to the artwork in the *With Needle and Brush* exhibition.
